1. Lung, left excision (ZZ001234 #2): Lung with inflammation and fibrosis, see note.

NOTE: Sections of lung demonstrate severe inflammation. These findings correlate with the patient's diagnosis of Lyme disease. Clinical correlation is recommended.

Previous biopsy report from the Lung and Tissue Clinic of America (04-2020) shows that sections of Mr. Christopher Robin's lung have demonstrated inflammation in the past. Mr. Robin is a 59 year-old Portuguese male. The patient is accompanied by his daughter, Winnie, who is a 10th grade student at Paradise Falls High School.
