CHIEF COMPLAINT:

John Johns ("JJ") is a 45 yr old male admitted to protocol 11-G-1111 complaining of knee pain.

HISTORY OF PRESENT ILLNESS:

This is a forty-five year old male with a history of ACL tear and repair now c/o new R knee pain.

DRUG AND THERAPEUTIC HISTORY:

Allergies: no known drug or latex allergies
Current medications: Tylenol #3 as needed for knee pain

PAST HISTORY:

Medical: High BP, depression
Surgical: ACL repair right knee (2000)

FAMILY HISTORY:

Father died at 56 from heart attack.
Mother is 89 years old with hypertension and depression.

PSYCHOSOCIAL HISTORY:

Works as a security guard at Bad Criminals Prison in Delinquent County.
No ETOH use.

PHYSICAL EXAMINATION:

Vital signs: Temp. 97.5, pulse 300, respirations 45, blood pressure 1000/500, weight 200 lbs.
Neck: supple, no masses
Cardiac: WNL
Chest: clear to auscultation
Abdomen: no acute findings
Extremities: right knee swelling, 3+ tibial pulse, normal DTR
